- Q.14 When talking, are there any changes in the length of sentences and the number of utterances when the topic is clear or unclear?
- Q.15 Discuss whether words that are difficult to tell their meaning are really meaningless.
- Q.16 Discuss why such words exist.
- Q.17 Considering through the above questions, discuss what characteristics are common to all languages, even though there are various kinds of languages.
